

ORDINANCE NO. 241

An Ordinance establishing regulations for the use of the highways and streets of Freeport Borough, and prescribing penalties for violations of this Ordinance.

The Borough of Freeport hereby ordains as follows:

Section I. That for the purposes of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply.

(a) The term "major repair" for the purpose of this shall mean any type repair or any type of vehicle that lasts for a duration in time exceeding four (4) hours.

(b) The term "person", as herein used, shall be taken to mean an individual or individuals, company partnership, firm, association or corporation.

Section II. The public streets and highways of the Borough are hereby declared to be for the common use of the traveling public except insofar as the same may be resurrected herein or by other proper municipal action.

Section III. No person shall place or cause to be placed any obstruction above, upon or under any public street or highway, except with the consent of Council and subject to such conditions as Council may impose, and then at the risk and responsibility of such person.

Section IV. No person shall place or throw or cause or permit to be placed or thrown any glass, metal, refuse or other substance or material upon any street or highway.

Section V. No person shall engage in the major repair work of any vehicle on or upon any street or highway.

Section VI(a) Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any of the terms of this Ordinance shall on conviction thereof before any District Magistrate of the Borough be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$50.00 and costs of prosecution, for each separate offense, and in default of payment thereof, shall be committed to the Armstrong County jail for a period of not more than five (5) days for each separate offense, with the right of appeal, as in other cases of summary

conviction.

(b) All fines levied, or served and paid under the terms of this Ordinance shall be payable by the Justice of the Peace to the Treasurer of the Borough for the general use of the Borough.

Section VII. Any ordinance, or part of an ordinance, conflicting with the provision of this ordinance shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
