

FREEPORT BOROUGH
ORDINANCE NO. 267

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LOITERING ON PUBLIC STREETS, SIDEWALKS, ALLEYS, CURBS, OVERPASSES OR PUBLIC PLACES IN THE BOROUGH OF FREEPORT, ARMSTRONG COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TOGETHER WITH PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FREEPORT, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE SAME.

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person or group of persons to loiter on any street, sidewalk, alley, curb, overpass or public place in the Borough of Freeport, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania.

SECTION 2: For the purpose of this Ordinance, loitering is defined as the act of standing or idling on or about any street, sidewalk, alley, curb, overpass or public place so as to hinder or impede or tend to hinder or impede passage of pedestrians or vehicles.

SECTION 3: Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction before a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, be guilty of a summary offense and will be subject to a fine not to exceed \$300.00 or confinement in the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days or both.

SECTION 4: All Ordinances or parts or Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
